# SPECTATOR SAFETY MANAGEMENT

## Leading to a NVQ Level 4 Qualification

The Emergency Planning College (EPC) is delighted to announce it will be running a new programme designed to give a professional qualification in Spectator Safety Management (SSM).

The field of spectator safety has increasing demands on it. The Emergency Planning College, which is the National Centre of Excellence for civil protection, emergency planning, public safety and crisis management training, will offer a programme dedicated to helping professionals achieve the required standard of competence; which is in line with the Government's new Green Guide.

## Why are you offering this course?

There are a number of new requirements, driven by the Government's Green Guide, which mean that spectator safety needs to be enhanced. Furthermore, event management needs to provide competent people to plan, manage and monitor for these major events.

## Who is taking it up?

The British Standards are seen as leading the field in SSM. They are being adopted by a number of European countries, FIFA and UEFA, as well as being translated into several European languages to coincide with the flagship events which are coming over the next few years.

## Who should attend?

The SSM programme is aimed at events organisers, police, ambulance, local authorities, safety officers and other professional organisations involved in crowds, safety and safety management.

## How long is the course?

The course will last 1 week at the EPC; and equip delegates with the practical and written skills to progress to the assessment phase of the NVQ Level 4, which is completed at the work place.

## How do I qualify?

Pre-attendance modules, if required, can be completed on the EPC's soon to be launched iLearn internet learning system. There is the opportunity to accredit prior learning and this will be done in conjunction with City & Guilds.

Also, other EPC programmes can be used as part of delegates' development in this area to improve knowledge and understanding of this critical area of safety management.

## When does the course run?

We have initial dates in December and then regularly throughout 2011. Details will be posted shortly on the website, and a full brochure outlining the course and its aims will be available.

## What is included?

The programme has 2 aspects, which will be based at the EPC and a post course assessment. The college component includes:-

- All lecture and course notes
- Mentoring
- Accommodation
- Breakfast, lunches and evening meals
- Tea and coffee available all day

## What facilities do you have?

The College has excellent on site facilities, including:-

- 102 en-suite bedrooms with double beds  
TV, Hairdryer, Tea/Coffee facilities
- Purpose-build conference rooms

## How much is the course?

The figures are yet to be fully finalised, however at this stage, indicative pricing is **£2,475**.
